



Περίληψη :

Orcistus was a bishopric of the province of Galatia II (Salutaris) until the 12th century. From the 9th until the 12th century the bishopric of Orcistus was under the jurisdiction of the metropolis of Pissinous and occupied the 7th or 6th position among seven bishopric sees.

1. Bishopric of Orcistus

The first known bishop of [Orcistus](#) was Domnus, who in 431 signed the acts of the [Third Ecumenical Council](#) in [Ephesus](#). In 451 the bishop of Orcistus Longinus took part in the [Fourth Ecumenical Council](#) in Chalkedon. The acts of the Quinisext Ecumenical Council ([Constantinople](#) 691-692) Segermas signed as the bishop of Orkosetos. Orcistus is mentioned as a bishopric in the *notitiae* from the 9th until the 12th century and was under the jurisdiction of the [metropolis of Pissinous](#) of the [province of Galatia II \(Salutaris\)](#).¹ In the *notitia* no.4, which dates to the second half of the 9th century, the bishopric of Orcistus is mentioned in the last position between the seven in total bishoprics of the metropolis of Pissinous, whereas in all the rest of the *notitiae* it holds the last but one (sixth) position.² For the period from the 12th century onwards no information on the bishopric of Orcistus is preserved.

The Notitiae episcopatum are official documents of the Patriarchate of Constantinople and Antioch, containing the ecclesiastical dioceses in hierarchical order. These documents were modified regularly.
